What do we mean by 'celebrating'?

'...skill-based approach needs to be **complemented and augmented** with a focus on choice-led which aims to develops children's engagement with texts.'

'Thinking creatively about celebrating reading and **offering regular events alongside coherent and planned RfP pedagogy** can support children's **motivation** and their **perceptions** of themselves as readers.'

'...a celebration can help to **reshape their understanding** of what it means to be a reader and to read.'

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What do we mean by 'celebrating'?

- ★ Valued placed on personal/volitive reading for enjoyment
- ★ Transcending ability, attainment and attitude
- ★ Assurance for keen readers, support for reluctant readers
- ★ 'Little and often', as well as 'big and flashy'
- ★ As important for adults!
- ★ Seeking out opportunities

Reading Schools Framework

Key area 3.2.1: Rewarding progress and recognising personal achievements

Generating excitement around reading for pleasure, demonstrating to learners that 'success' is different for each person, highlighting the quality and diversity rather than the quantity of reading, ensuring learners feel valued

CORE

Schools should reward the progress of individual learners

SILVER

Schools should celebrate reading in wider groups or as a whole-school

<u>GOLD</u>

Schools should widen celebrations to include the community


